**Subject:** Self Contained Breathing Apparatus Purchasing

The fire department is looking to purchase multiple new Self Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA) to replace the existing ones. There are two main components to the SCBA; which include the pack that holds an air bottle and an air bottle, which holds compressed breathing air. This piece of equipment is used for each Firefighter while working in an immediately dangerous to life or health (IDLH) environment. It allows the Firefighter to breathe clean air, provides protection against heat, and provides eye protection while the Firefighter is operating in these environments. Due to the nature of the calls and the normal wear and tear that an SCBA goes through, the air bottle has a life span of 15 years. The current SCBA bottles on the department are near the end of their operational life and need to be replaced this year.

Currently, the fire department is using the MSA Self Contained Breathing Apparatus in which we have had a lot of success, it is familiar to the Firefighters, and it is used by most of our mutual aid partners. The pack that is currently being used by the department is an older model, for which it is difficult and expensive to replace parts when needed. The MSA G1 SCBA is what we are looking to purchase from Macqueen Emergency to replace the existing packs and bottles. Although there is not an expiration date to the air pack alone; it is not financially responsible for the department to maintain the current packs. The MSA G1 Self Contained Breathing Apparatus has the latest technology which improves maintenance, functionality, and longevity. This model is one that is widely used on many departments around the state and even the country.

SCBA's are a non-budgeted item; however, this purchase would be procured through the 10% fund that is funded by charitable gambling proceeds. The current balance of this fund is \$120,942.14. Personal protective equipment (PPE) falls under the guidelines of the American Rescue Plan Act Funds (ARPA) that we obtained though the federal government for COVID recovery – that account balance is \$144,908.25.

Staff recommends the purchase of MSA G1 Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA) from the quote provided by Macqueen Equipment in the amount of \$142,697,14. This quote is through a vendor with our HGAC Buy Cooperative Purchasing contract that the fire department has for purchasing public safety equipment. This contract allows us to purchase equipment off one quote through the organization.


Re: Recommendation to sell the Sewer Jetter and Street Sweeper

With the recent purchase of the new sewer jet truck, we need to begin the process of selling the old truck. In the past, we have had a lot of success with using Govdeals.com auction site for selling our used equipment and we are recommending utilizing this site again. This site opens up the bidding to a nationwide group of people looking for used government equipment. We have sold old equipment to people in Wisconsin, Pennsylvania, and Florida. The auction site is capable of reaching many potential bidders.

Public works is also recommending that we sell our street sweeper. We have been contracting with Minnesota Street Works for approximately 5 years, and the department has been very satisfied with the success of contracting out our street sweeping services to this company. They have determined that in an emergency Minnesota Street Works is very responsive to their needs for rapid maintenance of our streets; they no longer feel a need to house, maintain, and insure a City owned street sweeper.

The street sweeper is a 1996 Elgin Pelican P series with 27,318 miles and 7552 hours and the jet truck is a 1991 Ford/Vactor with 54,000 miles and 8,198 hours
