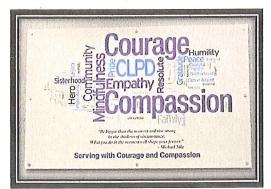
Shaping Our Organizational Culture

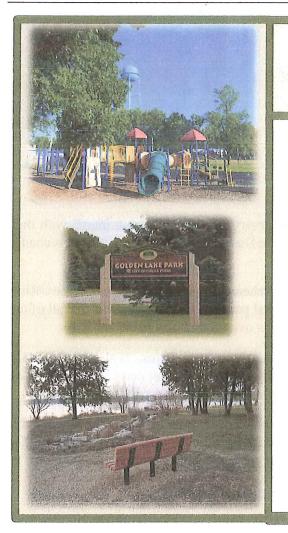

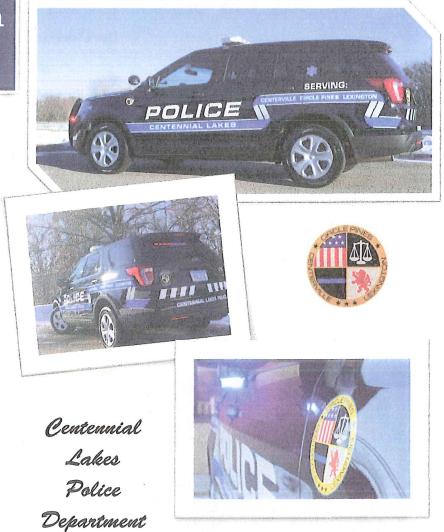

New Graphic Design

According to a cover story in the August, 2016 issue of Law & Order magazine a police vehicle's design should emphasize "safety and identification". Many law enforcement agencies have also begun to incorporate various symbols, badges, patches, City logos, mission statements, and mottos to better represent the communities that they serve as well as their service priorities and policing philosophies.

There seems to be a distinct shift in police patrol vehicle design schemes taking place throughout the Country. Some of it may be attributable to changes in image and/or the need to garner more support from the community at large. For a number of years the trend had been for a more retro looking black and white color scheme for squads with any graphics/decals arrayed solely on the door panels. This certainly has been the case among most law enforcement agencies in our metropolitan area (both large and small).



Lately, many local agencies are opting for a sleeker, more contemporary, and approachable image with their squad graphics. Many of the winners of the 2016 Law & Order Vehicle Design Contest are reflecting this change as well.

Several months ago when we set about developing a different design scheme for our Community Service Officer vehicle a local graphic design company provided us with an additional proposal for new graphics for all of our marked patrol units. We have since begun to transition all of our units over to this new look.

The design prominently reflects our Department name and the names of our three Cities. It also retains many existing elements of safety and identification, including our motto, Department seal, unit number, EMS symbol, and safety chevrons. New wheel covers give the squad a more contemporary look.

Over the next year or so we hope to eventually transition all of our existing marked units over to the new graphic design and wheel covers. I believe that this new design and style for our squads is in keeping with our continuing goal of projecting a positive, professional, and approachable image of ourselves and of our Department. •

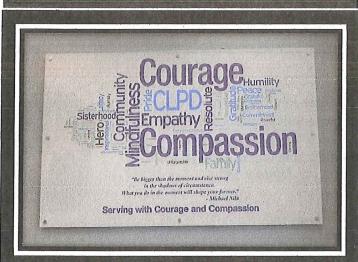

Lethality Assessment: A Vital Tool in the Fight Against **Domestic Violence**

Between 2006 and 2011, Anoka County law enforcement agencies responded to an unprecedented number of lethal domestic violence calls for service. Fourteen people were killed as a result of domestic violence during this time period. This astonishing statistic put our criminal justice system and advocacy programs on high alert. Agencies were shrouded in confusion and frustration over so many unanswered questions surrounding such shocking acts of domestic violence. The Centennial Lakes Police Department wasn't immune to the violence either. In fact, Centennial Lakes responded to two separate lethal domestic violence calls between 2009 and 2011.

The growing number of deadly incidents pushed Anoka County agencies to seek a more proactive, innovative approach to their response, launching our department into a vital role in the development of what is now one of the most successful lethality assessment programs in the state.

Anoka County's criminal justice and advocacy partners developed a committee in 2011 to respond to the unusually deadly violence occurring in intimate relationships in our communities. The committee was tasked with engaging the communities, law enforcement agencies and advocacy programs in a discussion about a topic that was typically hidden by those who suffered from the violence and its effects. They needed to find answers to questions, solutions to challenges and innovative ways to prevent further lethal violence. As a result of the committee's research, Anoka County and its partnering agencies, both law enforcement and civilian, initiated the Lethality Assessment Program. Since its inception, there's been a drastic reduction in the number of lethal domestic violence cases law enforcement agencies have responded to. Not only have deadly encounters been reduced and prevented, but new successful victim services protocols have been implemented and utilized by the program's advocates.

Anoka County has been fortunate in receiving federal grant funding from the Office on Violence Against Women for the past 8 years to support the Lethality Assessment Program. The grant funding has assisted our agencies and advocacy groups achieve unprecedented success in our fight against Domestic Violence. In 2016, our program connected 81% of victims with a Domestic Violence advocate. This connection was made from the scene by an officer connecting the victim immediately to an advocate 81% of the time. Also, according to Anoka County's data, 75% of over 330 victims have received or are currently receiving ongoing services. The grant funding has also provided innovative solutions to offender monitoring including Pre-Trial conditions specific to domestic assault and GPS monitoring for the highest-risk offenders. Our court systems have been champions in the fight against domestic violence by expediting cases through the system to avoid delaying or prolonging a victim's case resolution. All of these tools and more have created a victimcentered response that prioritizes the victim's safety and offender accountability through comprehensive and systemic change. Each grant year, Anoka County finds more ways to improve the Lethality Assessment Program and creates solutions to new challenges faced in the ever-changing realm of domestic violence. The Centennial Lakes Police Department continues to play an integral part in developing and managing a successful, holistic approach in Anoka County to keep our families and communities safer and better equipped, and to shine a light on the darkness of domestic violence. •

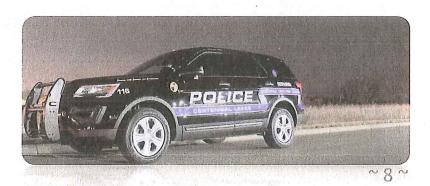

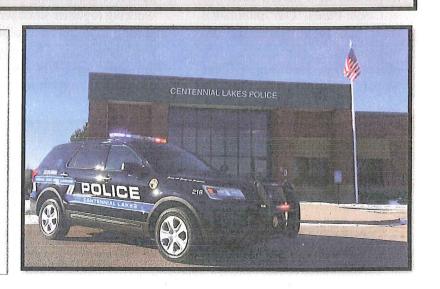

Each week Danika Peterson and Ben Hayle create a news program that highlights events, people, issues, and information important to citizens of our Member Cities. Some March highlights include the local non-profit Cars for Neighbors donating their 1,000th car, a Minnesota foodshare month feature about local food shelf Southern Anoka Community Assistance, Allina Health exercising an option to buy Mercy Hospital-Unity Campus from the North Suburban



Hospital Board, and the new Blaine Police Coffee with a Cop program. In addition to daily playbacks of North Metro TV News on the cable systems, there are over 368 local stories archived for viewers on the NMTV YouTube page. The page can be accessed through the northmetroty.com website.

Meet the New Staff

The two open positions at North Metro TV have been filled. Trevor Scholl was hired as our Municipal Producer. He has a degree in Journalism from the University of Minnesota and has been working as a video producer for over three years. He interned at North Metro TV three years ago, and then continued helping out even after his internship was over. He was eventually hired on a part-time basis to assist the news team. At the same time he was working part-time for Northwest Community Television creating content for their Cities. Trevor will be responsible for creating video content for the seven City channels.

Matt Waldron was promoted from Sports Producer to Video Engineer at the end of March. Matt has been with North Metro TV for 15 years in that capacity. Over the years be has been the go-to guy for engineering the production truck and solving technical issues throughout the system. He was very involved in the NMTV HD upgrade, from planning to integration. Not only is he technically adept, he is also skilled in video production, computer animation and graphics, and networking. He has already solved several problems for Cities and has been out and about familiarizing himself with City systems. He will be assisting Cities with any HD upgrades.





Special Olympics

Studio Manager, Eric Houston, organized a production opportunity for members of the NMTV Video Club, to shoot footage of the Special Olympics Games in the Twin Cities. He worked with organizers of the event to obtain permission, schedules, and press credentials for NMTV producers. He then worked with Brett Wong and Dave Bauer, both of Lino Lakes, to review techniques for shooting the event. Dave and Brett spent a day shooting basketball, swimming, and weight lifting. They interviewed coaches and even an umpire. They both said it was an awesome experience and that they learned a lot about



shooting events in the field. Eric will be working with Dave and Brett to edit the footage into programs.

The Wizard of Oz

T.J Tronson wrapped up production on the Centennial Elementary production of the Wizard of Oz. He used three cameras and then edited the footage in post. We don't play concerts or plays on our channels because of copyright issues, but we know parents want to see their kids performances, so we videotape them and then make DVD copies available for parents to purchase.

Every Movie Ever

Eric Houston has developed a new series of programs that are being produced with the help of three young men, with special needs, who visit North Metro TV weekly for work experience. Two of the gentlemen are from Blaine and one is from Ham Lake. The show purports to be an attempt to review every movie ever made, and is called Every Movie Ever. Our three volunteers edit the program and create all of the graphics. They have been very quick to acquire these skills and are able to create finished programs with minimal supervision.

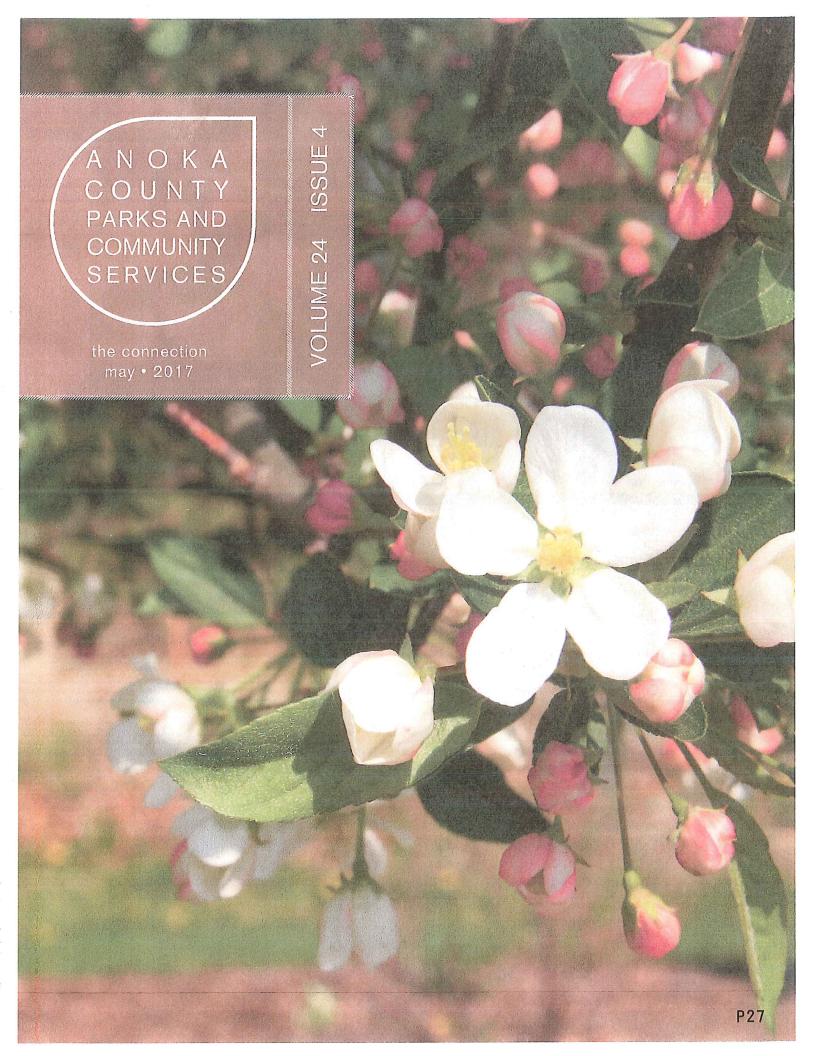

EVENTS AND UPDATES

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FROM THE DIVISION MANAGER:

In early April, the managers of our License Bureau and Passport Services Department presented their annual report for 2016 to the Parks and Community Services Committee. Once again, we had another phenomenal year of accomplishments and performance outcomes.

For starters, I'm always impressed by the number of transactions that our staff process on a daily, monthly, and annual basis. In 2016, our staff handled 449,434 transactions! That equates to about 1,820 per day, or about 215 per hour, divided among our five license centers and two passport centers.

In 2016, our staff processed:

- 266,577 motor vehicle registrations and renewals
- 96,544 driver's license applications
- 21,220 Minnesota DNR related licenses
- 7,886 passport photos and applications
- 3,090 game and fish licenses

The License Bureau and Passport Services Department not only handles this volume of work with a great amount of dedication and customer focus, they also produce some excellent financial outcomes for the County. The amount of revenue retained by the County was \$3,252,718, after deducting the portion that goes back to the state and federal government (since most of our transactions are related to various state licenses, tabs, or federal passports).

At year's end, the total net revenues after expenses was \$244,420. Once again, the department not only achieved its target net revenue goal of \$144,948 but exceeded it by \$99,472. This achievement puts the department in a good financial position going into 2017, with the opportunity to reinvest revenues back into the quality of our services and facilities.

Speaking of investment, the License Bureau and Passport Services Department also completed some nice improvements in 2016. The newly expanded passport office was opened in Blaine in September. We now have a much larger lobby space for our customers, improved counter space, and better support facilities. Additionally, the department also implemented a new iNovah receipting system, made enhancements to the check-in kiosk system, and rolled out a new E-Marriage application process.

Again, I can't say enough about the excellent staff who are operating our license and passport centers, and our great managers, Paula Anderson and John Lenarz. I frequently receive nice comments from the public who share their positive experiences. This reflects our outstanding team of 45 caring and friendly employees who go the extra mile to help our customers work through their individual needs.

Spring has sprung. Time to get the bikes down. I'll see you on the trail.

ANNUAL SUCCESSES FOR RECYCLING & RESOURCE SOLUTIONS

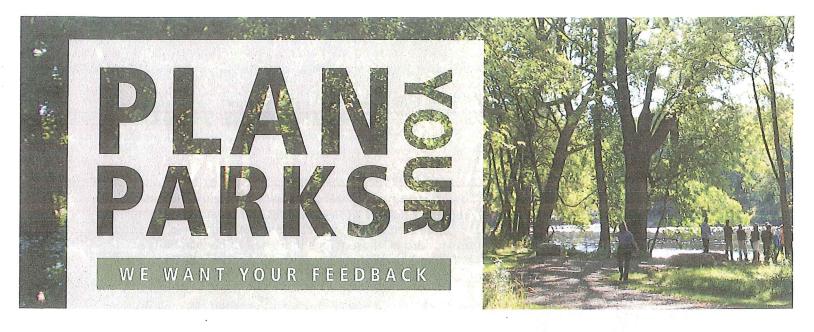
The Recycling & Resource Solutions Department just completed our annual reports to the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) and we found residents and businesses recycled 52% of their waste. Examples of those materials captured for recycling include metals, glass, plastic, paper and organics. These results were achieved through partnerships between public and private entities. We are making progress but there is more work to do. By 2030, each metro county must achieve a 75% recycling rate.

2016 also saw the implementation of the county organics recycling drop-off program as well as many municipal drop-off programs for organics, giving residents greater access to organics recycling options.

For Anoka County's part, our staff directly provided outreach and assistance to 20 community festivals and events; county staff also helped them provide recycling and organics recycling for their attendees. The county provided much needed funding for municipalities to implement increased recycling efforts throughout the year. Some of our municipal partners also worked together to do joint collection events; these partnerships increased efficiencies and provided great services to the residents of the county.

Our non-residential assistance program continues to be robust. We also provided grant funding for 45 businesses and 13 schools to increase their recycling efforts. We contracted with Minnesota Waste Wise to do recycling outreach to 95 area businesses and they estimate 930,574 pounds of material will be diverted annually to recycling. One example is Continental Development Corporation, which owns and operates a strip mall in Blaine. They worked with each business within the strip mall to provide technical assistance and grant funding to purchase recycling containers.

The challenges of achieving a 75% recycling rate moving forward into 2030 will be faced head on with practicality, fiscal responsibility and public and private entities working together.

NATIONAL BLUE AND GREEN DAY

National Donate Life Blue & Green Day is observed annually in April. Every April, people are encouraged to wear blue and green to promote organ, eye and tissue donation. According to Donate Life America, nearly 124,000 people in the United States are awaiting some type of organ transplant. Organ donor registration is critical.

Donate Life Minnesota, is managed by LifeSource, the non-profit organization dedicated to saving lives through organ and tissue donation in the Upper Midwest. The license centers play a vital role in helping LifeSource spread awareness about the importance of organ, eye and tissue donation.

- Information is displayed on the video kiosks in each center and educational handouts with answers to frequently asked questions are available at the information stations.
- Staff collect donations for the "You and \$2" program when customers renew their motor vehicle registration each year. This charitable contribution supports state efforts to ensure that people in the community have the information they need to make a positive decision about donation.
- Staff ask customers who are applying for or renewing their driver's license or ID if they'd like to register to be a donor

All Anoka County license centers actively participated on April 21st by "showing their colors" and support for Donate Life. Staff dressed in blue and green, decorated their offices, and had employee blue and green potlucks to celebrate.



PREPARING FOR THE CAMPING AND PICNIC SEASON



The winter to summer transition period for parks operations is a hectic time. After winter activities and projects are complete and the related equipment is maintained and stored, attention turns toward all those things that need to happen before pavilion and campground reservation season opens at the end of April.

In the field, maintenance crews can be found cleaning up the winter's accumulation of debris on the grounds in preparation for mowing. Roads, lots, and trails are cleaned, and any potholes that developed are patched. Seasonal water systems, such as restrooms, drinking fountains, and irrigation systems are pressurized, faults-corrected, and tested for safe public use. Courtesy docks are put out at the public accesses. Playgrounds are inspected and impact material is added to ensure safety standards are met. Every pavilion and restroom is thoroughly cleaned and stocked.

From the maintenance facilities, equipment and supplies are distributed to their summer locations, and seasonal staff are recruited, interviewed, hired, and trained. All this activity culminates in having the parks in tip-top shape and ready for reservations just in time for opening day. Staff take great pride in providing clean, high-quality parks facilities for the public to enjoy.
