If it is taller than 4' it will need to be cut into 3' lengths.

Each year we all have to reacquaint ourselves to the winter driving and parking routines.

RESIDENT REMINDER

The City of Lexington prohibits parking vehicles on any street between the hours of 2:00 AM and 6:00 AM, from November 1st to April 1st without an emergency parking permit issued by Lexington City Hall. By Ordinance, it is <u>unlawful</u> for any person to park a vehicle on any street after a <u>continuous or intermittent snowfall</u> during which there has been <u>an accumulation of two (2)</u> <u>inches or more of snow</u> until all snow, ice and similar debris has been plowed or removed from the paved portion of the street.

Vehicles not adhering to this Ordinance are subject to a parking ticket and towing at the owners expense.


Lexington's Public Works Department would like to offer the residents on corner lots or curved

streets free curb markers that you can place directly at the curb to help the plow drivers save some sod on the first few snow falls. Once the snow banks get built up and they are wing plowed further back the markers will get broken off and will not be needed any more. The markers will be available at city hall. You can also mark utility boxes(cable, phone, etc..) With all the holiday cooking going on this time of year please check to make sure your smoke detectors are in working order. Cooking leads to over 70% of fire injuries this time of the year. Remember change the batteries in your smoke detector 2 times a year. Make sure you have one in every bedroom and one in the hall outside each bedroom and one on each level of your home.

The City of Lexington has inspected and licensed most of the Rental property. We would like to thank all of you who have worked hard to obtained your rental licensed . We however are still trying to get the last few to finish up with their last inspection. We encourage those people to please take the time to get it done! Recycle Your HolidaysTM

is a one-of-a-kind statewide holiday light recycling program in Minnesota created and managed by the Recycling Association of Minnesota (RAM). Drop off unwanted light strings at any of our 450+ participating locations during the holiday season starting November 25th through the end of January each year. The program is promoted statewide in partnership with WCCO, Ace Hardware stores and many other partners. It employs over 200 individuals with disabilities at vocational centers throughout the state of Minnesota. The strands are dismantled by vocational center clients and properly recycled locally.



The Anoka Conservation District is now accepting preorders for the annual tree and shrub sale. The District offers a wide variety of native stock, including black cherry trees, mixed oak trees, red maple trees, and white pine trees. The trees and shrubs are sold in bare root seedlings or transplants and are approximately 10" to 24" in height. They may be purchased in bundles of ten for \$17, or twenty-five for \$30 **not including tax**. Native prairie seed and tree aides are also available. **You do not need to be an Anoka County Resident to order.**
