# **Road construction updates:**

## <u>West Restwood Road, South Hamline Avenue, and West</u> <u>Flowerfield Road:</u>

The City of Lexington is continuing to move forward with rehabilitating Restwood Road, Hamline Avenue, and Flowerfield Road in 2017. Tentatively, a public hearing is planned for either November or December of 2016 to hear comments from citizens along those portions of the streets that will be affected. Notices will be mailed out when the public hearing will be held. Project bidding is expected to happen in February with construction to begin in the spring or summer of 2017.

# Lake Drive:

According to Anoka County Highway Department, tentatively, the final phase of construction for Lake Drive will begin in 2017 with the project bidding to happen during the winter of 2017, and construction commencing during the spring or summer of 2017.

# IT'S THAT TIME OF YEAR AGAIN !!!!!!!

With summer gone, fall upon us, and winter just around the corner it's time to start thinking of the other changes that affect us this time of year, namely parking restrictions and snow removal.

Parking restrictions will begin November 1st.

\*\*\***No Parking** allowed on City streets between the hours of 2 AM and 6 AM without an emergency parking permit issued by a friendly face at City Hall.

\*\*\***No Parking** on any street after a snowfall with accumulation of 2 inches or more until all snow, ice and similar

debris has been removed from the paved portion of the street.

\*\*\* **It is illegal** to remove snow from private property and place it on the road or sidewalk.

\*\*\*Approximately 200 accidents occur each year

involving snow moving equipment, so be extra cautious and always **Give** the plow truck the benefit of the doubt,

it weighs in excess of 50,000 lbs., your car weighs about 3,000 lbs.

STAY SAFE...Assume snowplow drivers do not see you.

## Halloween Safety





If you set jack-o-lanterns on your porch with candles in them, make sure that they are far enough out of the way so that kids costumes won't accidentally be set on fire.

Make sure your child carries a flashlight, glow stick or has reflective tape on their costume to make them more visible to cars.

Don't leave any lighted candles or Jack-O-Lanterns where they could be knocked over by a swinging tail or by a curious cat. Not only could your pet start a fire but they could severely burn themselves in the process.

#### **Compost sites:**

#### Materials accepted and fees:

Leaves and Grass (and other non-woody yard waste)

The following materials can be mixed together and are charged the same rate; acorns, garden waste, grass clippings, leaves, pine cones and needles, sod (residential quantities), soft bodied green plants and weeds.

- \$5.00 for each load up to 4 cubic yards.
- An additional 50 cents per cubic yard will be charged in excess of 4 yards.

Leaves and grass must be debagged. Please unload your yard waste and take your

bags or containers home.

# **Cold Weather Rule**

The State of Minnesota set up the Cold Weather Rule to help customers who cannot pay their gas bill in full. It does not completely stop winter disconnections but provides customers extra protection from October 15 through April 15. The rule defines:

- What you can do if you receive a Notice of Proposed Disconnect
- What you can do if you have been disconnected and want reconnection of gas service

If you receive a Notice of Proposed Disconnect, CenterPoint Energy also will send you the following materials to help you manage your gas bill:

1. Information about your rights and responsibilities 2. Information about how to reduce energy use3. A list of agencies that help pay fuel bills

4. A list of weatherization providers

In order to avoid disconnection or to have service reconnected, you must either pay your bill in full or call

CenterPoint Energy at 612-372-4680 or

1-800-729-6164 (toll-free) and enter into a Payment Plan. You must keep the Payment Plan during the Cold Weather Rule months in order to continue to receive protection from disconnection.
