### From the City Administrator's Desk:

Several Lexington citizens have asked about the new "GreenStep City" signs that have been placed underneath our Lexington entrance signs and what it means.

In short, the Lexington City Council had determined during their 2015 Strategic Planning process that one of their goals was to become a more environmentally conscious community and they approved the idea of working toward becoming a GreenStep City.

To summarize Lexington as a GreenStep City:

On August 8, 2015, the Lexington City Council approved a Resolution to become part of Minnesota's GreenStep Cities program. This voluntary program is designed to help our community achieve environmental sustainability goals through the implementation of 29 best practices. These best practices are organized into five focus areas: land use, buildings and lighting, economic and community development, transportation, and environmental management.

The best practices focus on cost savings, quality of life and energy use reductions that encourage a culture of innovation. 119 cities and 3 Tribal Nations, large and small, encompassing over 45% of the state's population, have joined this voluntary program, which was launched by the League of Minnesota Cities at their June 2010 conference.

Cities that implement a minimum number of best practices within the five categories below will be recognized as Step Two and Step Three GreenStep cities. Each best practice can be implemented by completing one or more specific actions from a list of four to eight actions. A city's accomplishments are recognized on the GreenStep website. Measuring city performance metrics will garner Step Four & Step Five recognition.

The GreenStep Cities program grew from community and legislative interest in engaging local governments as partners in meeting the climate and clean energy goals articulated in the 2007 Minnesota Next Generation Energy Act. The program works in cooperation with the MN Pollution Control Agency and its partners. 
### **RUN FOR OFFICE:**

### NEW E-Poll Books

Beginning with the Primary Election on August 14<sup>th</sup>, Anoka County voters will check in at their voting precincts using a secure electronic poll book system which offers a more accurate and efficient check-in and registration process on Election Day. Also known as e-poll books, the technology has been in use in several Minnesota counties since 2016 and Anoka County is just one of many more counties moving forward with implementation in 2018. Benefits to the election process include: More efficient check-in no need to flip through pages, voter rosters. More accurate check-in - the e-poll book system prevents voter from accidentally signing on the wrong line. Election Day registration information is captured electronically and the system is able to scan some information directly from a driver's license. The system helps election judges by walking them through each step of the check-in and registration processes, virtually eliminating administrative errors. After the election, officials are able to directly upload Election Day vote history and registration data into the state system rather than performing manual data entry off paper forms, which can take months to complete.
