Week in Review

Listed below are the activities that occurred during the ninth and final week of major construction.

Monday 10/19/15

• Site cleanup and disturbed soil prep for landscaping by Hardrives Inc.

Tuesday 10/20/15

• Site restoration began with sodding of the Blaine side of the project starting at Lexington Avenue by subcontractor Central Landscapes.

Wednesday 10/21/15

- Site restoration continued with sodding and hydroseeding of the Lexington side of the project by subcontractor Central Landscapes.
- Street sweeping and curb cleaning for final bituminous wear course was done by Hardrives Inc. Thursday 10/22/15
 - Paving of final bituminous wear course was done by Hardrives Inc.

Things to Come

At this point in time construction on the project site has come to a close for the year. However, there are still tasks left to complete by the contractor that are minor in nature. Periodically you may see Hardrives Inc. or one of the subcontractors on site completing final tasks before the project can be completely closed out.

As a result of project activities coming to a close, this will be the final project update letter for the season. In spring 2016, the sod and seeding will be checked to ensure proper turf establishment. Any areas found to be deficient will be corrected before the project is officially closed out. Depending on the items needed to be corrected and their impact to you, the residents, a project update letter will be sent out to inform you of when construction personnel will be on site.
