With the start of a new month comes the final home stretch of construction activities before this project wraps up. Listed below is the past week in review and what is left to come in the month of October.

Monday 9/28/15

October 6th Paving of remaining bituminous driveways. Raising of existing utilities to finished

grade.

October 7th – 9th Site restoration for sod and other landscaping activities. October - Paving of final wear course on Flowerfield Road.
